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A Word by the Executive Director

HIV and AIDS still constitute threats to humanity. Despite the efforts made all over the world, children and teenagers remain one of the most vulnerable targets. Interpersonal communication is a keystone in overcoming the effects of HIV. Lack of communication is a handicap in our daily life. Every family must make an effort to set up a permanent dialogue within the household, and to know a bit more about their children in order to give them the best information, since parents are the only ones who want the best for their children.

It would be wise to involve the more vulnerable strata (children and teenagers) at all levels of the effort to truly defeat HIV.

Again this year, our organization has not spared any effort to relieve the consequences of HIV in the port area.

We take advantage of this occasion to thank our partners, People's Health Movement (PHM), Fondation de France, the SP/CNLS-IST and the Centre Médico-Social d'Adamavo, including workshop heads, parents of students, and school principals, for their financial, technical and moral support leading to the success of this year's activities.

THE CILSIDA ASSOCIATION

History

In June 2003, a group of dynamic young people created an association named Club Initiated to Fight AIDS (CILSIDA, from the French acronym). Convinced that youth health and the respect of human rights are veritable sources of human progress, they based CILSIDA on the difficulties faced by youth in matters of reproductive health, HIV, AIDS, STDs, and the respect of human rights. The Togolese authorities legally recognized this association under the receipt number 0773/SG-MAT-DAPOC-DOCA on September 12, 2007. CILSIDA is active in the fields of reproductive health, infection prevention, social care and social rehabilitation. It is composed of young people, most of who are students, who use their different talents to help their peers raise awareness of the disastrous consequences of HIV. From its foundation till today, CILSIDA has 30 active members, among which there are 9 females (one infected with HIV), and 760 supporters. CILSIDA collaborates with other associations to make its initiatives more effective. This led the association to become a founding member of the Network of Youth and Teenager Associations Fighting AIDS in Togo (RAJAS/TG), of the Coalition Togolese for a Responsible and Respectful Tourism (C2T2R), of the People's Health Movement (PHM) Right to Health Campaign (RTHC), of the Legal Togolese HIV Network, and of the Togo Framework for Volunteer Associations and NGOs. CILSIDA is also a member of Togo's National Youth Council (CNJ-Togo), of the African Health Network (RSA), and of the online UN volunteers. In 2008, CILSIDA hosted a Japanese intern.

Mission: To create a favorable and friendly learning setting that induces behavioral changes, to facilitate the acquisition of knowledge and competence and to offer services adequate to the needs of young people, teenagers, and children.

Main goals:

- To fight STDs/HIV/AIDS, and child dealing and trafficking.
- To promote the rights and duties of children.
- To create leisure, information, tracking, follow-up, and centers.
- To encourage and support private initiatives of young people.
- To develop and cultivate friendships and a spirit of tolerance.

INTRODUCTION

The Adamavo community is one of the communities of the port area, facing problems such as illiteracy, rape, lack of adequate information, poor communication, poverty, etc.

Our organization CILSIDA has been making an effort to initiate activities for parents, children, young people, and teenagers of this community since 2003.

This year's goals are:

- To use additional support to improve our ability to reach young girls in and out of school.
- To publicize the outcome of the first 5 years of CILSIDA action.
- To elaborate the cartography of married female teenagers in the Adamavo community.
- To set up a youth and teenager club in the Adamavo community.
- To organize a conference/debate on child mistreat and abuse.
- To show the impact of HIV on the lives of human beings.
- To maintain interpersonal communication within the family.
- To provide training for CILSIDA members/volunteers.
- To review 2008 Achievements and prepare an Action Plan for 2009.

The financial partnership with organizations such as People's Health Movement and Fondation de France, and the technical partnership with SP/CNLS-IST have contributed to the achievement of some of our 2008 goals.

In this fifth year of operations, the financing of our activities was not as high expected.

Faced with such a situation, the Board of Directors of CILSIDA has made every effort to mobilize resources from good-willed people to allow the achievement of certain tasks.

THE UNICEF PROGRAM

➤ Overview

The United Nation's Children's Fund (**UNICEF**) has been supporting us financially in cooperation with the Togolese government since 2005 in order to organize activities beneficial to the underclass.

For the welfare of children and adolescents, the concept « USP, amie des jeunes » (USP, friend of the children) was put in place at the heart of CMS Adamavo. The activities surrounding USP are realized conjointly through the « USP, friend of the children », as well as the organization CILSIDA.

This year, due to certain parameters, our organization has not been directly associated with CMS Adamavo, for the realization of activities in favor of parents and youth related to « USP, friend of the children ».



THE PHM PROGRAM

➤ Overview

The People's Health Movement (PHM) cooperates with the circle PHM-Togo to support us in accomplishing concrete actions that improve the sanitary wellbeing of the citizens.

➤ *Development of the document about the evaluation of the right to health and medical services in Togo*

After a voting session with the members of the circle PHM-Togo, a team has been set in place for the development of the use of donations to establish a report on the right to health and medical services in Togo. In order to collect data, the members of the circle have searched through five health regions of Togo : the maritime area, the Lomé community, the plateau area, the central region and the steppe.

This data has enabled the creation of a document that evaluates the right to health and medical services in Togo.

THE FONDATION DE FRANCE PROGRAM

➤ Overview

Being committed to creating an environment without HIV and wanting to support young girls and adolescents in the community of Adamavo, the organization CILSIDA has submitted a proposal to the Foundation of France on a project called “Reinforcement of social and sanitary services to meet the needs of sexual health and of the reproduction of married adolescents in the community of Adamavo”.

➤ *Reinforcement of the capacity of out of school girls and adolescents*



Objectives

General Objective

The aim of this session is to develop the abilities of the members of the club of young girls and adolescents out of school on the subject of sexual and reproductive health, to communicate between the leaders of the national response so that they are able to do a count of married adolescents, to enable the research of cartography and to bring their technical help to the reduction of HIV infections.

Specific objectives

- ✓ Raise awareness among young girls and adolescents out of school in Adamavo about sexual and reproductive health, as well as about interpersonal communication
- ✓ Conduct a mapping of married adolescents in the community of Adamavo
- ✓ Visit homes and participate in discussions and conversations in Adamavo

Realizations



From October 13th to 17th 2008 an awareness session for young girls and adolescents took place in the premises of the Boutique Terrasse Millénium. These meetings have reinforced their awareness of sexual and reproductive health, and of interpersonal communication. The adolescents are also capable of using their experiences, communication techniques, and data collection for cartography.



Achievements

- ✚ 35 people have strengthened their abilities and are well equipped for the fight against HIV.

Difficulties/Constraints

The patrons were reluctant to take on five (5) days with their apprentices.

The majority of apprentices have a low education level.

Recommendations

To the beneficiaries

Put acquired knowledge into practice for the achievement of the project's objectives.

To the ONG performer

Make a request among the other associates to research supplementary funds for the finalization of the project.

To SP/CNLS-IST

Find and bring support for resource mobilization. Do a follow-up on the project's activities.

To the Foundation of France

Mobilize resources for the support of the project.

- *Survey within the community of Adamavo for the development of a cartography of married adolescents*



Objectives

- ✓ Determine the names of married adolescents in the Adamavo community
- ✓ Map the married adolescents in Adamavo
- ✓ Promote the participation of young girls and adolescents out of school in the Adamavo community

Realizations



As a result of the reinforcement of capacities, meetings have been arranged with the consultant to draw up strategies and data collection files for the survey.

A team is set up for every health district of Adamavo.

From October 21st to 29th 2008, 30 beneficiaries of the formation have patrolled the eight (8) scheduled zones

Achievements

✚ Generation of a document on the cartography of married adolescents in the Adamavo community

✚ 320 married adolescents have been identified

Difficulties/Constraints

Certain married adolescents were not willing to be identified

Recommendations

The recommendations of the document resulting from this survey have to be taken seriously in order to be able to respond to the expectations of this vulnerable target.

- *Monthly meeting*



Objectives

- ✓ Maintain permanent contact with young girls and adolescents out of school
- ✓ Reinforce interpersonal communication among young girls and adolescents out of school
- ✓ Give young girls and adolescents out of school a sense of responsibility

Realizations

Following a prearranged schedule, the monthly meeting permits the presentation of activities that were achieved during the preceding month. These meetings also allow for the development of certain competencies in the art of cooking, as well as for everyday conversations.

Achievements

- ✚ Existence of a dynamic group of young girls and adolescents
- ✚ Young girls and adolescents out of school participate actively in reunions

Difficulties/Constraints

Tardiness of certain young girls and adolescents out of school at reunions

Recommendations

These meetings have to be ongoing for the welfare of the young girls and adolescents.

➤ *Home visits*

Objectives

- ✓ Maintain permanent contact with the married adolescents
- ✓ Offer psychosocial help to married adolescents

Realizations

The formation's participants are following their predefined schedule of home visits to married adolescents identified in the Adamavo community.

Achievements

- ✚ The married adolescents are supported on a variety of subjects
- ✚ Young girls and adolescents make home visits

Difficulties/Constraints

Absence of certain targets.

Recommendations

Mobilize more resources for the initiative.

THE CILSIDA PROGRAM

➤ Overview

This year, the CILSIDA organization has contributed a great deal to the financial, technical, and human plan for the realization of many activities.

➤ *February 2, 2008 press conference at Afanoukopé*



Objectives

- ✓ Use the media to inform the population of CILSIDA's activities in Togo
- ✓ Present the account of five years of activities

Realizations



On Saturday, February 2, 2008, CILSIDA's Executive Director, Director of Programs, and Vice President held a press conference in front of various media organizations in the offices of the socio-cultural center of Afanoukopé.

Results Obtained

- ✚ 11 media organizations covered the press conference
- ✚ Account of five years of activities
- ✚ Presentation of the 2008 plan of action

Constraints/Difficulties

Insufficient financial means to arrange for the presence of a television station.

Recommendations

Organize this activity each year.

➤ *Educational talks with out-of-school youth*



Objectives

- ✓ Maintain interpersonal communication with out-of-school youth
- ✓ Make out-of-school youth and adolescents aware of the harmful consequences of HIV infection

Realizations

Once a month, an educational work session is held with out-of-school youth in their meeting center.

Results Obtained

- ✚ 120 out-of-school youth have benefitted from educational talks
- ✚ Active participation by out-of-school youth

Constraints/Difficulties

Occasional absence of some youth from sessions

Recommendations

Each youth must try hard to actively participate in these sessions. This initiative must continue.

➤ *Spelling Contest*



Objectives

- ✓ Bring youth and adolescents to demonstrate their talent in spelling to stop the propagation of HIV infection
- ✓ Give youth and adolescents a sense of responsibility faced with the scope of HIV infection

Realizations

After taking a written test, the best candidates were selected for the final phase where the contestants took a test based on their knowledge of HIV and AIDS.

Results Obtained

- ✚ 100 youth and adolescents tested their knowledge of HIV infection
- ✚ 10 youth and adolescents have a good knowledge of HIV infection

Constraints/Difficulties

Insufficient financial means for a perfect organization

Recommendations

Perform more advocacy with partners to continue this initiative.

➤ *Educational talks with women who produce smoked fish*



Objectives

- ✓ Make women who produce smoked fish aware of HIV infection.
- ✓ Put in place interpersonal communication at the heart of this group of women

Realizations



The first trimester of 2008 served to hold educational talks with women who make smoked fish at Katanga. Many themes were debated to bring these women to be conscientious in their daily lives given that they are more vulnerable.

Results Obtained

- ✚ 100 women who make smoked fish have benefitted from educational talks
- ✚ Active participation of women who make smoked fish

Constraints/Difficulties

Lack of financial and logistical means

Recommendations

The support of partners in this initiative proves to be necessary.

➤ *Creation of a youth club at Adamavo*



Objectives

- ✓ Create a framework of cooperation for young adolescents from the community of Adamavo and surrounding neighborhoods

Realizations

After an effective analysis of the situation of HIV infection with youth and adolescents, it was judicious to find alternatives to parades, one of which is the creation of this club on July 12, 2008 in the CMS Adamavo complex. A team of seven adolescents has been put in place to organize the club's activities.

Results Obtained

- ✚ Existence of a club of dynamic youth and adolescents
- ✚ Monthly meeting with the youth and adolescents of the club

Constraints/Difficulties

Working with the youth is not easy. Certain parents are still reluctant to let their children join this club.

Recommendations

Resources must be mobilized to maintain these adolescents in order to permit them to acquire skills for a healthy and responsible life.

- *Education of CILSIDA members from October 15th to 19th at CEG le Portique*

Objectives

- ✓ Reinforce the knowledge and skills of CILSIDA members on the topics of sexual and reproductive health, HIV prevention, and tuberculosis

Realizations

In the framework of annual training of CILSIDA members, the members of CILSIDA (25) and other volunteers (4) from the community reinforced their skills over five days from the 15th to the 19th of September 2008 in the facilities of CEG le Portique.

This skill-building centered on generalities, tuberculosis, malaria, risky behaviors, sexual

and reproductive health, and the prevention of HIV infection.

This year, the education was led by a national instructor.

Results Obtained

- ✚ CILSIDA's members and volunteers reinforced their skills and are well-equipped for the struggle against HIV infection, malaria, and tuberculosis.

Constraints/Difficulties

Insufficient financial means

Recommendations

This initiative must be continuous to allow members to acquire other skills.

- *Education of members of the Adamavo youth club from September 17th to 19th at CEG le Portique*

Objectives

- ✓ Reinforce the knowledge and skills of the members of the club for young adolescents on the topics of HIV prevention and peer education

Realizations

After having created the club, it was judicious to reinforce the capacities of members on various plans. At this first training session, emphasis was placed on preventing HIV infection and on peer education. This meeting took place from the 17th to 19th of September 2008 in the facilities of CEG le Portique.

Results Obtained

- ✚ 25 youth and adolescents reinforced their knowledge and skills and are well-equipped for the struggle against HIV infection.

Constraints/Difficulties

Insufficient financial means

Recommendations

This initiative must be continuous to allow members to acquire other skills.

- *Organization of the global child abuse day on November 19, 2008, and the presentation of prizes to the winners of the first spelling contest at the Complexe Scolaire Sainte Angèle*



Objectives

- ✓ Make the population aware of children's rights
- ✓ Ban mistreatment and abuse of children in the Adamavo community
- ✓ Give members of the Adamavo youth club an opportunity to express themselves

Realizations



On Thursday, November 19, 2008, at the Complexe Scolaire Sainte Angèle, the members of the Adamavo youth and adolescent club led a debate/conference.



This conference was introduced by two skits on mistreatment and abuse of children. The second part was used to present prizes to the winners of the first spelling contest.

Results Obtained

- ✚ Youth and adolescents led the conference/debate
- ✚ Parents attended the conference
- ✚ Presentation of prizes to the winners of the first spelling contest

Constraints/Difficulties

Limited financial and logistical means

Recommendations

Mobilize resources to make this an annual initiative

- *Discussion group with orphans and vulnerable children*



Objectives

- Give children the opportunity to express themselves
- Give hope to orphans and vulnerable children

Realizations

To let orphans and vulnerable children feel more at ease, a discussion group was organized in which children express themselves through stories, songs, recitations, etc.

Results Obtained

- ✚ Active participation of orphans and vulnerable children
- ✚ 22 orphans and vulnerable children attend discussion groups

Constraints/Difficulties

Lack of necessary materials for this activity.
Cramped workspace.

Recommendations

Bring in people of good faith and partners to keep these orphans and vulnerable children in this atmosphere.

- *Presentation of gifts to orphans and vulnerable children on the 19th and 22nd of December 2008*



Objectives

- ✓ Allow orphans and vulnerable children to live decently

Realizations

On the 19th and 22nd of December 2008, with the technical support of ALCEBON and the contribution of our organization, CILSIDA, registered orphans and vulnerable children benefitted from gifts of school materials and children's toys.



Results Obtained

- ✚ The orphans and vulnerable children benefitted from gifts

Constraints/Difficulties

Insufficient gifts

Recommendations

ALCEBON should always provide its support so that orphans and vulnerable children can be helped.

- *Assumption of responsibility for orphans, vulnerable children, and people living with HIV*

Objective

- ✓ Provide unfailing support to orphans, vulnerable children, and people living with HIV

Realizations

Impoverished children have been sent to school. Responsibility has been assumed for people living with HIV.

Results Obtained

- ✚ Twenty (20) people living with aids and two (2) orphans/vulnerable children have been taken responsibility for.

Constraints/Difficulties

Pauperization of people living with HIV.
Lack of funds for medical tests.

Recommendations

Develop revenue-generating activities for people living with HIV.

➤ *Academic monitoring of orphans and vulnerable children*



Objectives

- ✓ Follow the scholastic course of orphans and vulnerable children.

Realizations

CILSIDA members and volunteers perform academic monitoring of orphans and vulnerable children by visiting them at their schools and meeting with their teachers to evaluate the children's work.



Results Obtained

- ✚ Orphans and vulnerable children are well supervised on their scholastic progress

Recommendations

Continue this work for the well-being of orphans and vulnerable children

➤ *Monthly meeting with people living with HIV*

Objectives

- ✓ Established sustained contact among people living with HIV
- ✓ Create a framework for dialogue for people living with HIV

- ✓ Fight against stigmatization and discrimination

Realizations

Once a month, in the facilities of CMS Adamavo, CILSIDA members and people living with HIV meet to exchange ideas.

Results Obtained

- ✚ Permanent contact with people living with HIV

Constraints/Difficulties

Absence of certain people living with HIV

Recommendations

Mobilize resources to make this program of meetings permanent.

The organization of Global AIDS day 2008



Objectives

- ✓ Organize Global AIDS day for 2008
- ✓ Provide adequate information for young students regarding the HIV infection.

Execution



The students from six educational institutes from the Adamavo community were briefed by CILSIDA members and volunteers all morning.

A team of two visited each one of the target institutions:

School complex Sainte Angèle, CEG Eureka A, CEG Eureka B et C, CEG Saints Pierre et Paul, CEG le Pont et CEG le Portique.

It should also be noted that the Sainte Angele team was aided by the student teacher and the executive director of the organization

All the members connected with the CMS Adamavo compound several minutes later to participate in the same-day celebration as part of USP “ami des jeunes.”

This activity, which took place in several educational institutes, drew on the technical plan of SP/CNLS-IST.

Results obtained

- ✚ Discussion with youth and adolescents from six different schools
- ✚ A total of eight hundred and twenty-eight (828) students reached.

Constraints/difficulties

Insufficient financial backing

Recommendations

Cover all the schools in the Adamavo community next year. Also, more technical support from SP/CNLS-IST for this project.

- *Review of the activities of 2008 and a description of the 2009 planning period of December 26th to 28th 2008 at Gbodjomé.*



Objectives

- ✓ Make a summary of all the activities organized in 2008
- ✓ Elaboration on the plan for 2009.

Execution

From December 26th to 28th, 2008, CILSIDA members met at Gbodjomé, a location about 10 kilometers from Lomé, to review the events of 2008 and further discuss the plans for 2009. With each member participating enthusiastically, this event was a great success.

Results obtained

- ✚ A summary of the events organized during 2008.
- ✚ Development of a plan for 2009.

Constraints and difficulties

Certain members were absent. The time allotted for the event was not sufficient.

Recommendations

Plan this event to last longer and ensure that each member makes a serious effort to attend this meeting, as it is essential to the organization.

CHALLENGES AND VIEWS

- ✓ Find ways to approach solutions to the daily problems of the community with respect to STDs, HIV and AIDS.
- ✓ More effective handling of targeted groups.
- ✓ Work regularly with religious and community leaders.
- ✓ Mobilize a good deal of resources to achieve the goals set by the group.
- ✓ Come up with other activities aimed at youth and teenagers.
- ✓ Get the women of groups involved in the process of discussion and argument.
- ✓ Create a record of activities.


CONCLUSION

The impact of HIV on daily life has put a brake on the development of a nation. The infection rate in vulnerable sectors of society is still alarming despite our best efforts. The organization CILSIDA, despite a lack of financial support, has done excellent work with the young girls and adolescents, married teens, youth, and children to reach the assigned objectives. CILSIDA hopes that its partners will reply to requests so that it will be able to contribute towards the fulfillment of the goals set out by the national strategic plan of the fight against AIDS and HIV from 2007-2010.

In addition to the realization of these enormous activities, CILSIDA has been asked to coordinate the activities of PHM-Togo and RAJAS/TG.

CILSIDA participated (from May 6th-9th in Brazzaville, Congo) in a training workshop on the rights of people with aids, and a workshop that confirmed the map of high-risk areas that ran from the October 8th to 12th, 2008 in Kpalimé. CILSIDA also participated in a training workshop in Adjidogomé regarding the follow up and evaluation of a project.
