

NEW SIX-MASTED SCHOONER.

The Addie M. Lawrence Sent Off the Ways at Bath, Me.

BATH, Me., Dec. 17.—The weather did not affect the launching of the big six-masted schooner Addie M. Lawrence, which gracefully slid overboard from the yard of Percy & Small this noon. The vessel was christened with champagne by Miss Lawrence of Fairfield, the daughter of the Hon. Edward J. Lawrence, and the young lady for whom the craft was named.

After the launching a banquet was served in the cabin by Capt. William R. Kreger, who will command the craft. It is expected the vessel will be ready for sea by next Saturday, as she was launched all rigged and practically complete.

MR. VANDERBILT'S CONDITION.

Dr. Flint Says There Is No Change in His Patient.

The condition of Cornelius Vanderbilt, according to his physician, Dr. Austin Flint, at 7:10 o'clock last night, was unchanged. The patient has been in the same condition for the past three days. At the request of Mrs. Vanderbilt, he said, he refused to talk further about his patient.

Dr. Flint left the Vanderbilt house at 10:45 o'clock, when he said there had still been no change and he had left his patient sleeping.
