

COLLIDES AND SINKS IN FOG.

**Fishing Boat Goes Down When Struck
by Schooner—Crew Escapes.**

VINEYARD HAVEN, Mass., Aug. 28.—

The sinking of the fishing schooner Shenandoah of Gloucester, after collision with the six-masted schooner Addie M. Lawrence, became known when Capt. Gannon and the crew of sixteen men of the Shenandoah arrived here to-day on the Lawrence. The collision occurred early yesterday in a dense fog about five miles east northeast of the Great Round Shoal lighted buoy near Nantucket.

The Lawrence, which was bound from Portland for a coal port, struck the fisherman amidships on the starboard side. The crew barely had time to leave the Shenandoah in their seine boat and reach the Lawrence before their vessel sank.

The Lawrence lost her jibboom and headsails.
